Surgical Procedure Consent Form

Your pet will have an intravenous catheter placed before anesthesia. An intravenous catheter provides a direct route to the bloodstream. The use of intravenous fluids during surgery facilitates adequate cardiovascular performance, reduces stress on the heart, assists in maintaining your animal's temperature, hydration, blood pressure, and reduces the time it takes for your animal to fully recover from anesthesia. While undergoing the procedure, your animal will receive anesthetic drugs that prevent pain. Additional pain medications will be provided, as needed, to control the level of your animal's discomfort both after surgery and during their recovery at home. Any other concerns or procedures that you would like for the Veterinarian to look at/ and or perform while your pet is with us
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today.
We highly recommend your pet having preanesthetic bloodwork to evaluate major organ function and to rule out any underlying metabolic disease prior to anesthesia unless these screens were performed at your presurgical consult or within the past 3 months. For mass removal procedures only: Biopsy/Histopathology Would you like your pet's mass submitted to the laboratory for testing? A biopsy provides crucial information about the nature of the mass and will determine if it's cancerous or benign. Testing will also help provide a prognosis and guide a treatment plan if indicated. The cost for one sample is \$395.98 and two sites is \$539.98
